THURSDAY, OCTOBER 13:

EXCURSION to the old royal city of **PÍSEK** (museum in the former royal palace, besides historical monuments recent reconstruction after horrible floods of 2002; LUNCH in a typical old style restaurant), visit to the Memorial Museum of Antonín Dvořák at **VYSOKÁ** (the last living grandson of the famous Czech composer has promised to open for us also the currently inaccessible family private summer residence – villa Rusalka - where many chefs d'oeuvre were written) and finally some remarkable places at **PŘÍBRAM**. The participants will have lot of opportunities to discuss various geoethical problems of interest and to prepare their materials for the final meeting of the AGID Working Group on Geoethics. The price (15 € per person – lunch included) will be paid at the registration desk. The departure at 9.00 AM (in front of the hotel Belveder).

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 14 (since 9 A.M.):

Short communications still acceptable for presentation

Further written contributions (usually short communications up to 2 pages) can be accepted until September 15 – preferably as soon as possible. They will be included into the Proceedings volume and into the final version of the program for Symposium participants. In case of interest to present additional oral (not written in advance) communications contact the convenors.

Languages

The oral presentation of papers and communications will be mostly held in **English**, in several cases in **Russian**. Simultaneous translation will not be arranged but - if necessary - consecutive abbreviated translations of discussions will help to ensure mutual understanding. The papers will be published mostly in English, in case of publishing the original text in another language an enlarged resume will be published in English. Possibility to use other language than English should be consulted in advance with the convenors.

Arrival to Příbram

The participants are asked to arrive to Příbram in accordance with the arrival date as indicated by them in the registration form. The citizens of many countries can enter the territory of the Czech Republic without visa (**ask for details the Czech Embassy or any travel agency in your country**), on the other hand **visa** for citizens of other countries (outside European Union) still have to be purchased (valid for the Schengen area of the European Union).

<u>VALID PASSPORT is absolutely necessary as well as the HEALTH INSURANCE</u> (the organisers do not take any responsibility for accidents or illness that might occur during the symposium or in the course of the travel). If a special personal letter of invitation from the organisers is needed ask for it IMMEDIATELY.

Usually the visitors arrive to **Příbram via PRAGUE** which is easily accessible by any transport means. The cheapest local transport in Prague is the municipal transport (subway system at all principal railway stations).

From the Prague airport to the downtown area take the **bus Nr.119** to the final station **Dejvická** when you enter the subway system (the "green" line C to the city center - Můstek); if you prefer to continue directly to Pribram then use the **bus Nr. 100** to the final station **Zličín** when you enter the "yellow" subway line B and go out at the station **ANDĚL**.

The best public transport from Prague to Příbram is by BUS (the terminal in Prague – usually platforms 5, 6 - is situated nearby the subway station ANDĚL - the "yellow" line B). There are frequent direct connections from there to Příbram (about 60 minutes needed for the transport). Arriving to Příbram go off at the station POLIKLINIKA Nr. 2.

You can find your way ANYWHERE IN THE CZECH REPUBLIC using <u>www.mapy.cz</u> and asking for appropriate questions.

Hotel accommodation

All participants will be accommodated at Příbram in accordance with the wishes indicated by them in the registration forms. **The accommodation cannot be guaranteed for very late registrations (after September 30).** When you want to arrive to Příbram **earlier than October 12**, you will get the respective information where to go to your hotel. We shall try to locate the participants preferably in the **hotel BELVEDER** in the vicinity of the Symposium residence (on the first come – first served basis). Moderate prices in all places. THE ACCOMMODATION AND MEALS ARE TO BE PAID BY EACH PARTICIPANT IN CASH (USUALLY IN THE LOCAL CURRENCY) in respective hotels and restaurants. The hotel price usually includes a breakfast. - In case of any unexpected change or cancellation of your arrival DO NOT FORGET TO INFORM US IMMEDIATELY BY ANY **MEANS.** If you do not arrive without any explanation for the first night indicated in your registration form your reservation will be cancelled and you can be also asked to pay for one night accommodation.
