#### **Abstract Submission**

Geoethics is an interdisciplinary field between Geosciences and Ethics which involves Earth and Planetary Sciences as well as applied ethics. It deals with the way of human thinking and acting in relation to the significance of the Earth as a system and as a model. Scientific, technological, methodological and social-cultural aspects are included (e.g. sustainability, development, geodiversity and geoheritage, prudent consumption of mineral resources, appropriate measures for predictability and mitigation of natural hazards, geosciences communication, museology, etc.), their liaison with concepts of geoeducation is evident. Also the necessity of considering appropriate protocols, scientific integrity issues and a code of good practice - regarding the study of the abiotic world - is covered by this discipline developed by the conveners (V. Nemec and L. Nemcova) since 1991. Studies on planetary geology (sensu lato) and astrobiology also require a geoethical approach (as suggested by the co-convener J. Martínez-Frías). It is necessary to incorporate geoethical principles in the optimal way into the consciousness and the daily life of the global society. All efforts of not only Earth and Planetary scientists, ecologists and pedagogues but also of other professions including managers, leaders, politicians and statesmen at any level should respect - in the sense of geoethics their own responsibility for the fate of our planet and of all its inhabitants including the future generations. Geological factors need to be reflected and respected in any concept of environmental sustainability. Thanks to the interdisciplinary approach a need arises to seek new priorities emphasizing more and more the solidarity of human kind - defined by the International Declaration of Geoethics.

Pribram is a town about 60 km SW from Prague, with a long mining history (famous School of Mines until 1945). Details about the Mining Pribram Symposium history (since 1962) etc. have been frequently described in previous issues of GEOETHICS NEWS. Many visitors know the specific character of geoethical sessions at these Symposia

(organized since 1992) with allocated times for listening to presentations as well as for discussions in the course of coffee breaks and elsewhere. The time table makes it possible to use a tailor made plan of an individual sojourn. Some visitors limit their stay for the most important 2-3 days of lectures, some extend their stay for weekend visit(s) to beautiful Prague or other interesting localities more distant from Pribram. The new session on Geoethics was successfully held within in the 22nd Symposium on Geo-Environments and Geo-Technics (Dec. 7 - 8, 2012, Tsukuba) organized by Japanese Society of Geo-Pollution Science, Medical Science and Urban Geology (PMUG). #### Some recent activities of the National Group in the Czech Republic:

**Lidmila Nemcova** - present at the Castle of Prague to a State dinner for the President of Iceland - had an opportunity for a private talk with the President of the Czech Republic Professor Vaclav Klaus (also about geoethics); the Czech President is in contact with the former Czech geologist (and colleague of Vaclav Nemec) Prof. George Kukla (USA) discussing geologically interested problems (incl. global warming).

**Lidmila Nemcova** presented at Visegrad (Hungary) at an international conference *Spirituality and Sustainability* her lecture *Art as a means to increase sensibility for spirituality and sustainability.* –

In her capacity of the President of the Czech Society for Ethics in Economics Lidmila Nemcova organized a special block at the seminar of the Czech Management Association where **Vaclav Nemec** presented his lecture *Geoethical view of sustainability (remarks to Rio+ 20 conference).* He discussed to the same topic in a special meeting of the Society for Ethics in Economics organized in the Czech Parliament.

**Vaclav Nemec** was also invited as the only guest to the Annual meeting of the Czech National Geological Committee to refer about recent activities of AGID, IAGETH and IAMG as well as to comment the l'Aquila case.

The Scientific Council of the Mining Pribram Symposium has approved suggestions of Vaclav Nemec re preparation of the International Conference on Geoethics (October 2013).

The following remark can be discovered there:

"In fact, a false translation into English of the charges mentioned in the indictment act was circulated abroad by colleagues of some of these members. Based on this "translation", which stated that the charges were "to have failed to predict the earthquake" almost 4,000 researchers from 100 different countries signed a letter to the Italy's president, blaming the prosecutors. Even Nature believed this misleading information..."

A divisive character of the civic society in various states has been evident for anybody when reactions to the sentence in the process started without attending the real motivation (expected for January 2013).



Omitting – as promised at p. 1 – a divisive character of existing new geoethical communities in this very sensible topic I need to emphasize some basic geoethical problems as recently published in my article

#### Geoethics and Sustainability: 3.1.1 Conclusions to the case

Various geoethical problems connected with this case should be solved:

- a) a new legal access to "false alarms" and reasonable risk and danger levels should be established (up-dating internationally acceptable definitions and protection measures);
- b) any positive prediction whoever made it should be precisely analysed by "competent" institutes avoiding any underestimation of "incompetent" researchers;
- c) a reciprocal respect between scientists and the population should be based on the use of a reciprocally understandable language;
- d) scientists as well as media are obliged to respect and publish the complete verity about facts with clearly defined words to avoid any misinterpretation of results.

#### A fresh testimony from our National Group on Italy can be added:

Dear Prof. Nemec,

After reading some comments on the L'Aquila sentence, including one by Dr: Limaye of November 30, 2012, I wish to make a few remarks. Although some people realize that it would be better to wait for the sentence motivations, criticism is still kept alive, and (unfortunately enough) also international organizations joined the chorus of criticism. In face of more or less speculative reasoning, some basic considerations may be useful.

There is general agreement on the fact that earthquakes, even when associated to more or less persistent foreshocks, cannot be foreseen as for exact place, time and magnitude - and that major shocks cannot be excluded to occur in areas such as the Abruzzo (L'Aquila) region. One might resort to "probability", but - in face of possible disaster - emphasizing caution rather than idle lingering turns out to be a mandatory duty. So why should any scientist be available to make predictions of any type, and/or give opinions and "advice" to local or state agencies in charge of civil protection, instead of giving, in a simple and clear way, warnings of absolute unpredictability?

Translating this into L'Aquila case, why should any commission of scientists (no matter how prestigious its members), be established and entrusted the task of expressing opinions and even reassurances? Reassurances were indeed solicited by the Head of the state agency. Ethical behavior or, if you prefer, common sense suggests that any scientist should abstain from joining any such commission, avoiding involvement into a "bad" practice as outlined above. Instead, by accepting the appointment to a consulting service the members of the commission showed both disregard of science and subservience to the state agency in charge of civil protection.

Furthermore, even if you allow for the desire of serving the community in the evaluation of the natural event, no care was taken (by the commission) for ensuring a proper (correct) communication of the situation by the state agency to the local community, to the public and to the mass media. Instead, subservience to the Executive, in its effort to divulge minimization of risks, is exactly what came out during the process. In summary, no commission should have been formed, and individual scientists should have only stated flatly the impossibility of prediction.

May I stress that it would be wise to fully know the available documentation before expressing opinions and comments. As for the role of the Executive, this is really another story (developments about its responsibilities may ensue, and this is indeed what I expect to see).

Regarding the sentence, of course one might regret the harshness of the penalties and the lack of separation of individual responsibilities - or else complain about the difficulties, if not outright impossibility, of assessing precisely the risks of sudden natural events (not only of earthquakes).

But suspecting or even asserting that as a consequence of the verdict in the future no scientist will offer opinions on hazards of any kind for fear of litigation is either a disservice to intelligence or a ridiculous menace from immature geoscientists. The Implications of such complaints scent of dull defense not only of the scientists involved in the L'Aquila case, but also of the geological and geophysical professions. Let us hope that geoscientists will always get rid of temptations recalling policies of medieval guilds!

Of course I am ready to host the Pribram First International Conference on Geoethics based on solid historical and democratic roots of previous international meetings I had the pleasure and privilege to convene in geoethics since 1992 and in mathematical geology since 1969 (merits for VIP audience from abroad already in 1968).
